SITUATION: Tom misses his ball on the first tee ...



 $Q \cup E S \top I \cap N$: Does it count as a stroke if the ball remains in the teeing area? And is Tom allowed to tee the ball up again?

A N S W E R: Every swing at the ball with the intention of striking it counts as a stroke. Because the ball's still lying within the teeing area, Tom may place it on the tee again or even tee it up in a different place within the teeing area. Rule 6.2b(6) and definition "Stroke."
